## Overview

The application scoring system has three main parts: Seventh grade MAP assessment (33.3% of the total), seventh grade final grades for core subjects (33.3%), and the entrance exam (33.3%). The weights for the different parts are established by using a total of 900 points, with each 33.3% element worth 300 points.

## Seventh grade MAP assessment

We multiply the percentile ranking of the reading score by 1.515 to get a maximum score of 150, and we multiply the percentile ranking of the math score by 1.515 to get a maximum score of 150, so that reading and math together yield a maximum of 300 points. You can use the table at the far left to look up your score.

## Seventh grade final grades

Points are calculated for reading, mathematics, science, and social studies. Each 'A' grade is worth 75 points, each 'B' is worth 50 points, and each 'C' is worth 25 points. No points are awarded for a 'D' or an 'F' grade. A student with four As will get the maximum of 300 points, while two As and two Bs are worth 250 points. You can use the top middle table to determine your point totals.

We determine the entrance exam points by multiplying the total national percentile rank by 3.03 to get a maximum of 300 points. You can use the table immediately to the left to determine your exam score.

## Overview

### Seventh grade MAP assessment

We use national percentile rankings from the reading and math sections of the NWEA MAP assessment. For each result, we multiply the percentile ranking by .505 to get a maximum score of 50, so that reading and math together yield a maximum of 100 points.

### Seventh grade final grades

Points are calculated for reading, mathematics, science and social studies. Each 'A' grade is worth 20 points, each 'B' is worth 15 points, each 'C' is worth 10 points, each 'D' is worth 5 points. No points are awarded for an 'F' grade. The maximum points for final grades is 80.

For example, a student with four As will get the maximum of 80 points, while two As and two Bs are worth 70 points. Use the table above to determine your point totals.

### Interview

All eligible students are required to attend an interview. The maximum points for the interview is 100.

## Overview

## NWEA MAP assessment

We multiply the percentile ranking of the reading score by 1.515 to get a maximum score of 150, and we multiply the percentile ranking of the math score by 1.515 to get a maximum score of 150, so that reading and math together yield a maximum of 300 points. You can use the table at the far left to look up your score.

## Seventh grade final grades

Points are calculated for reading, mathematics, science, and social studies. Each 'A' grade is worth 75 points, each 'B' is worth 50 points, and each 'C' is worth 25 points. No points are awarded for a 'D' or an 'F' grade. A student with four As will get the maximum of 300 points, while two As and two Bs are worth 250 points. You can use the top middle table to determine your point totals.

## Eligibility

Jones College Prep and Hancock College Prep require general education applicants and applicants with 504 Plans to have a minimum NWEA MAP percentile of 24 in both reading and math in order to be considered for selection. Applicants with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and applicants receiving bilingual education services are eligible when their combined NWEA MAP percentiles in reading and math are 48 or higher.

## Overview

### Applicants residing outside of the attendance area:

The application scoring system for outside-of-attendance-area applicants has two main parts: NWEA MAP assessment scores and seventh grade final grades for core subjects. The weights for the different parts are established by using a total of 900 points, with each 50% element worth 450 points.

### Applicants residing within the attendance area:

The application scoring system for applicants who live inside the school's attendance boundary has three main parts: NWEA MAP scores, seventh grade final grades for core subjects, and a 50-point attendance area preference added just prior to selections. The weights for the different parts are established by using a total of 950 points, with the NWEA MAP assessment data and grades each comprising 47.37% of the total points at 450 each, and the 50-point attendance area preference allocation comprising 5.26% of the total points.

### Seventh grade MAP assessment

We use national percentile rankings from the reading and math sections of the NWEA MAP assessment. For each result, we multiply the percentile ranking by 2.2727 to get a maximum score of 225, so that reading and math together yield a maximum of 450 points. You can use the table at left to look up your score.

### Seventh grade final grades

Points are calculated for reading, mathematics, science and social studies. Each 'A' grade is worth 112.5 points, each 'B' is worth 75 points, and each 'C' is worth 38 points. No points are awarded for a 'D' or an 'F' grade. For example, a student with four As will get the maximum of 450 points, while two As and two Bs are worth 375 points. Use the table above to determine your point totals.

## Overview

### Seventh grade NWEA MAP assessment

We use national percentile rankings from the reading and math sections of the NWEA MAP assessment. For each result, we add 1 to the percentile then multiply the percentile ranking by .5 to get a maximum score of 50, so that reading and math together yield a maximum of 100 points.

### Seventh grade final grades

Points are calculated for reading, mathematics, science and social studies. Each 'A' grade is worth 25 points, each 'B' is worth 20 points, each 'C' is worth 15 points, each. No points are awarded for "D" and 'F' grades. The maximum points for final grades is 100.

For example, a student with four As will get the maximum of 100 points, while two As and two Bs are worth 90 points. Use the table above to determine your point totals.

### Interview

All eligible students are required to attend an interview. The maximum points for the interview is 300.
